

## What do I need to do to remain on the RCCP Register?

Practitioners registered with the RCCP have the potential to cause harm to patients. To reduce the risk of harm, registrants are required to demonstrate that they are fit to practice, both in terms of their competency and conduct. RCCP has a responsibility to ensure that registrants maintain fitness to practice and continue to meet its standards. This is carried out through monitoring the continuing professional development (CPD) activities that registrants undertake. This is important in supporting a culture of continuous learning and improvement, as well as ensuring the professionalism of registrants.

The RCCP audits 3% of CPD records every two years, which is in line with the audit requirements of the Health & Care Professions Council (HCPC). RCCP will contact registrants who are randomly selected for a CPD audit. Failure to comply with RCCP CPD requirements will result in a registrant's removal from the Register.
